# **Annual Awards: Frontrunner of the Year**

The Frontrunner of the Year displays overall athleticism, a competitive spirit, and good sportsmanship in reflection of the values of our club. In addition to running prowess, the Frontrunner of the Year also shines through volunteerism and participation in club events.

Perhaps this past week you saw American skiier Mikaela Shiffrin win gold in the Olympics. As a youngster, she had a poster autographed by another Olympian who wrote the letters ABFTTB under her signature. Mikaela has those same letters on her ski helmet which stand for: Always Be Faster Than The Boys.

Our Frontrunner of the Year has made good use of that motto as well. Throughout the awards, you've heard many of her stats - she raced seven times last year and finished in the top 3 overall in all seven of those races - winning five. She set personal records at 5K, 10K, 15K and 10 Mile. She scored the highest age grade of all the women in the club last year. She also ran the fastest 5K (21:05 Father's Day), 10K (42:08 Stars & Stripes) and 15K (67:08 Rockin Summer) for the women last year. In looking at the Top 10 boards in the foyer, you may not have noticed that she was the only female to race a 15K last year. So, instead of having her be a list of one, I just added her to the male list, where she was #3. In fact, if we ignore gender, Erin would be in the top 10 on both the 5K and 10K lists. And had she run a half or full marathon last year, she likely would have been in the top 10 of those as well.

She became our first ever female Trail Master Champion. And this is the first time, male or female, that the Trail Master Champion also won their division of the Champions Race.

Erin is one of our greatest volunteers and never hesitates to jump in and just get it done. She took on the planning for the LA Marathon water stop and has taken the lead on numerous LAFR events. She is currently our club Treasurer and will continue in that role for 2018. She also scores extra bonus points for being one of the only people who has some level of success in getting Bernie Tan to behave.

All of us who were there will never forget the great emotion when he achieved a lifetime goal of qualifying for Boston at the 2010 Camarillo Marathon, with Mark & Sean pacing him to a PR of 3:31:21.

In addition to his numerous athletic achievements over the years, Patrick is the Katherine Helpburn, Meryl Streep, Jack Nichsolson & Tom Hanks of LAFR Baking & Cooking Awards. His award winning contest entries have ranged from the sublime – crunchy kale cup crisps and individual dessert mousses – to the ridiculous – or perhaps even more sublime – chocolate soup.

While he thrived in the good-natured competitiveness of LAFR life, our club has benefited in immeasurable ways from his time, talents and treasure.

His organizational wizardry and professionalism have been integral to so much of what we do, from planning events (big & small), to maintaining positive relationships with outside organizations, to managing difficult challenges, and of course, quieting a noisy crowd when necessary.


In addition to offering award winning entries to every cooking and baking contest, he always throws in a bonus platter of cookies, brownies, or treats for the dessert table.




<u>**3**rd Place - John K & WTF</u>: Tied for third is two frontrunners who have had difficulty showing up on time for board meetings or any run, really.
