

Banquet Re-Cap: 2014 Club Awards

Frontrunner of the Year Carlos Vizcarra

Our 2014 Frontrunner of the Year had an outstanding year of running. He raced 8 times last year, with one race in particular standing above the rest. We'll get to that in a minute but first let's review the other seven: *He placed in the top 15 overall in every one of those races with 5 of those in the top 10.

*He also won or was 2nd in his age group in all 7 races. He started his year in April at the El Segundo 10K, where he was 7th overall. He then tackled the two local Pride Runs, running 16:54 to place 2nd overall in the Long Beach Pride Run 5K, and then in our Pride Run 10K, he ran 35:57 to again grab 2nd place overall. In between the two Pride Runs, Carlos joined the gang on our trip to the Mountains to Beach half and full and ran 1:17:48 in the half, placing 6th overall and winning the masters division. He also very generously brought along his partner, Sammy, to cart all of us around.

The summer brought lots of hard training for his fall marathon. In September, he ran the SRLA 5K, finishing 4th overall and 2nd in his age group and also was 12th overall, 2nd age group at the Rock n Roll Half in LA in October.

All of this hard work was in preparation for the California International Marathon in Sacramento in December. Carlos ran 2:44:51, the fastest marathon of the club for 2014 and his fastest marathon in over 10 years. 2014 was the 6th consecutive year that Carlos has run the fastest marathon in the club. And he has the notable distinction of running the two fastest marathons in the club this century.

If you've ever talked with Carlos about teaching and working with young people, you know how passionate

and devoted he is to his students. He is currently volunteering his time coaching for SRLA. Carlos is genuinely helping young people, many who are at risk, to shape and change their lives every day. In additionto his superlative running achievements, these are the qualities that make him our Frontrunner of the Year.



Randy Peck Service Award Yumi Afrento

Our Randy Peck award winner this year is one of our most active and outgoing Frontrunners. She is always present with a smile on her face and lots of love in her hugs. And if you're ever anywhere along a race course when she's there cheering on fellow Frontrunners, you better bring earplugs! The girls at Wellesley College are famous for the tunnel of sound they create with their enthusiastic screaming and free kisses at mile 13 of the Boston Marathon. Last year our Randy Peck Award winner was her own tunnel of sound at mile 16. At that point you are about to head into the infamous Newton Hills, so her shouting, screaming, shall we say shrieking (?) helped propel some of our members to Boston PRs...and helped Bernie forget he was running Boston one week after an emergency appendectomy!

We often speak of quiet service in reference to Randy Peck and I'm sure some of you have figured out who this year's winner is and you're asking yourself: Yumi? Quiet?

Yumi's quiet service happens away from the race course.

Her enthusiasm and thoroughness as a volunteer is astounding. Many of the best meals we enjoy after Sunday long runs, at major group events, or at premarathon pasta feeds await us as a result of her special recipes of a few carbs here, a bit of butter there, and tons of love mixed throughout.

She volunteered at just about every event we had last year and is on the board of directors for 2015. And she ran three 5ks last year and PR'd every time!

Los Angeles Frontrunners is a more vibrant, happy, well fed, and loving group as a result of her generous service.

Our 2014 Randy Peck Service award winner is Yumi Afrento.

Lifetime Achievement Award Bill Walsky

Bill Walsky, this year's Lifetime Achievement Award honoree joined Los Angeles Frontrunners in the late 1980s and has been an active member these many years, running, volunteering, and participating in all club activities. He is a previous winner of the Randy Peck Award and more recently was honored with the President's Award in 2014.

Bill is an addict for running and racing stats. His knowledge of running lore is enviable. He keeps up with racing events of every distance, from track to cross country to ultras, but his favorite distance is the marathon. He's completed 16 of those, the first being Grandma's Marathon in 1985, the last Surf City a week ago; his PR is 3:57 from Grandmas in 1993. He's also completed 40 half marathons and is an active member of the MARATHON MANIACS and the HALF FANATICS, two international racing clubs.

Bill is the go-to guy if you're trying to pick a fast marathon for a PR or a Boston qualifier. Years ago another of our esteemed members - Ric Munoz was struggling to crack the sub-3 barrier. Bill told him "Go to Sacramento in December and run California International." The result? A 2:58. A couple of years later, Munoz was inching toward a sub 2:50. Bill's advice: "You should run Grandma's." "Grandma's?" Ric replied, "what and where the hell is that?" Soon after crossing the finish line with a new PR. Ric found the nearest pay phone and called Mr. Walsky to thank him for his advice. A similar thing happened to me after finishing the 1999 Vancouver Marathon in near PR time – the first person I wanted to tell was Bill because I knew how much he would appreciate it.

What else can I say? He writes a column every month for The Front Page. He collects memorabilia from the 1964-65 New York World's Fair. He's a vegetarian and a walking IMDB. A truly deserving recipient of the 2015 Lifetime Achievement Award, my good friend Bill Walsky.

Our champ, **Eric**, raced 9 times in 2014. In 7 of those races, he won his age group and in all 7 of those races finished in the top 10 overall. He was the overall winner in both the Santa Clarita HandsOn 10K, where he ran 35:54 and the Music City Half Marathon, where he ran 1:16:01 (running the fastest times for the club at those two distances for 2014). He lowered his marathon PR by over 9 minutes last December, running a 2:48:13 and placing 3rd in the masters division at the Rocket City Marathon. He also partnered with Mark Johnson to win the LA Marathon Charity relay. Carlos trekked to the start line 8 times in 2014. In seven of those races, he finished either 1st or 2nd in his age group, with 5 wins and two runner-up finishes. He was in the top 2 fastest runners for the club in 2014 at 5K, 10K, half marathon and the full marathon (the 6th year in a row where he has accomplished that feat). He has been in the top 2 fastest runners at 5K, 10K, half and full every year since 2008.

Mark had an outstanding year of racing highlighted by two exceptional marathon performances. At Boston, he ran 2:56 to run the 3rd fastest marathon in the club in 2014. In the fall, on a windy course, he was the overall winner of the Surfers Point Marathon in Ventura. In addition, he was 3rd in his age group at the Mountains to Beach half and won his age group at both the Firecracker 10K and Surf City 10 Miler, where he was also 9th overall. He also teamed with Eric Alvarez to win the LA Marathon Charity Relay last March.

Our Trail Master champ, **Jonathan**, had an amazing year in 2014. He was 2nd overall in the Mt. Baldy Run to the Top trail race and the Boney Mountain 21K. He won both the Paramount Trail Half Marathon and the TransRockies Run 6 day event – a total of 120 miles over six days (basically racing a marathon of trail running for six consecutive days). Not only was he the overall winner of the event, but he won 4 of the 6 days and was 3rd on the other two.

Our second place winner, **Danny**, raced 6 trail races, including three 50 milers. He placed top 3 in his age group in 4 of his trail races and in addition

to his trail prowess, ran a Boston qualifying 3:09 at the Revel Canyon Marathon in November.

Bruce, the 3rd place finisher in the Trail Master division had a great year on the roads as well as the trails. He raced 5 trail races in 2014, placing 2nd in his age group at the



Griffith Park Trail Half Marathon and 3rd in his age group at the Pt. Mugu 18K.

Newcomer of the Year Jason Coleman

It's been a while since we've had a runner rack up the kind of stats our Newcomer of the Year did in 2014. Jason ran 34 races last year: four 5Ks, six half marathons, one 10 miler, twenty-two 10Ks, and in late December, his very first marathon. Then right after the new year, he ran his second full marathon. Because both marathons were within 16 days of each other, he qualified to become a marathon maniac as well!

His twenty-two 10Ks gave him the win for the most 10Ks in the 10K Challenge, with more than twice the 10Ks raced than 2nd place. He also finished the year in 2nd place in the 35-39 age group in the Grand Prix.

Jason was part of the 18 person Los Angeles Frontrunner team that participated in the LA Marathon 2-man charity relay, raising money for Students Run LA. His relay partner was David Dassey and that event was his very first half marathon. In addition to setting PR's at his first time distances, he also PR'd in the 5K.

He was an outstanding volunteer throughout the year, agreeing to join board as a director-at-large for the second half of 2014. He is our new Treasurer on the 2015 Board of Directors.



Most Improved Runner Mark DeAngelis

Mark DeAngelis did what no other LA Frontrunner did in 2014 – he PR'd at all four standard road race distances. He lowered his 5K PR to 21:01, his 10K PR over 8 minutes down to 41:51, his half marathon PR over 5 minutes down to 1:39 and his full marathon PR over 7 minutes down to 3:46.



Most Improved Honorable Mention Albert Giang & Raul Borja

Albert broke his 10K PR three times in 2014 and also lowered his half PR by two minutes. He was 5th in the very competitive 35-39 age group and continued to lower his times thru the end of 2014.

Raul raced in the the competitive 35-39 age group as well. He finished 4th in the age group and 6th in the Trail Master race. He raced from 5K to 50 miles and set new PRs at 10K and the marathon.






