News from Oregon and Antarctica by Jane Dods







In December, I went on one of the most amazing aventures of my life. And for this 81year-old world-traveler that's saying a lot! I spent over two weeks exploring Antarctica. I had never had a real urge to go there, but since it was the only continent I had not visited (and I found a really good price last spring for early-bird sign-ups) I thought what the heck, why not?

OH BOY, was it ever worth it! We saw jagged snow-covered peaks (the Andes) rising up out of the sea, seals lounging languidly on ice floes, humpback whales arching out the water in very close proximity and BEST OF ALL, we wandered about with penguins. They are not at all afraid of humans. In fact, we were asked to stay at least 5 meters away to respect their space. I learned that they walk "funny" because they have no ankles (I guess we would, too, under those circumstances!).

This was a trip offered by Road Scholar (formerly Elderhostel). We sailed out of Punta Arenas, Chile on a Norwegian ship, the Midnatsol (Midnight Sun). Our group was about 80 out of the full ship's complement of some 300+. The amenities were terrific. I had my own commodious cabin with a nice big window, and the public spaces were splendid. I enjoyed my nightly glass of wine on Deck 9 while gazing out at the unbelievable scenery. And the food - OMG! It's a pity I'm a light eater, but I did my best. Being a Norwegian ship, we had fish offerings at each meal (I skipped the breakfast delicacies).

I also took part in two "extras" which were offered - snowshoeing and kayaking. The snowshoeing was tough because it followed a hilly trail. The uphill wasn't too bad, but the downhill was definitely challenging. The kayaking amidst icebergs, however was fabulous. We were in two-person sea kayaks in a very calm bay. The person in back handled the rudder and therefore directed the steering. I was in front, so all I had to do was keep on paddling.

Lastly, I celebrated my birthday, December 21, during the trip. Usually this is the shortest day of the year, but this time it was the longest!





2017 Club Challenge Rules Changes

Like 2016, the 2017 LAFR Club Challenge has three categories: Most Races, Highest Age Grade (male and female), and PR Champ.

DISTANCES

For the Club Challenge, each month in 2017 has a designated race distance(s). For 2017, some months have more than one designated distance and two months are "Trail" months (trail races at any distance).

NEW RULES FOR CLUB CHALLENGE 2017:

1. In the MOST RACES category, there is a limit of 4 (four) races per month. This limit does not apply to age grade or PR. For example, if in April, you race 6 5ks, only 4 will count towards your "Most" total but age grades/PRs from all 6 races are eligible.

2. EXCEPTION to Rule #1: From 11/23 (Thanksgiving Day) thru December 31, there is no limit to how many races you can apply to your "Most" total.

3. Challenge Bonus races: these are designated races that will count for all three categories of the Challenge regardless of the designated distance for that month. In general, these bonus races include club races (Pride/Deo, etc.) and any out-of-town club race trips (Boston, Catalina, etc.).

4. For any month where the designated challenge distance includes half marathon, 15K will also be accepted.

2017 Trail Master Rules Changes

1. For 2017, the Trail Master division will combine your FOUR best trail results.

2. Bonus points for longer distances have been increased.
