

The Frontrunner of the Year displays overall athleticism, a competitive spirit, and good sportsmanship in reflection of the values of our club. In addition to running prowess, the Frontrunner of the Year also shines through volunteerism and participation in club events.

The 2015 Frontrunner of the Year has excelled in the past year in each of these areas. His love for our club and extended LAFR family shines through his volunteerism at events and cheerful support for fellow runners at workouts and races. Board members know that his presence at events means that the volunteer work will get done. Perhaps the best part of his volunteerism is his spirited cheerleading for the rest of us. In Sweden this summer, he logged early and long hours to support LAFR competitors at the Euro Games. And the Catalina Eco-marathoners were all welcomed back to Avalon by his warm presence.

I did my first 50K in Stockholm at Euro Games and it was a 6K loop course – Reg & Deo raced it as well, and Iknow I can speak for the three of us in saying how amazing it was on each loop for us to have him cheering for us and taking care of us. And he was so genuinely proud of us when we all finished.

And 2015 was a heck of a comeback year on the roads for this spry runner. He completed 22 races which included 12 finishes in the top 3 of his age group and 6 age group victories. He has been a consistent attendee at the Sunday long runs and faced down the challenge of the tough Sunday climbs to the top of Griffith Park in preparation for racing in Catalina. And at an age when most runners begin to cut back on distance and adventure, he ran his first 15K and half marathon in years...and won a gold medalin Stockholm in his first ever outing in the 2000 meter steeplechase.

And surprisingly, he has never won Frontrunner of the Year until now.

I think it must be his strong faith and love for others that makes him such a man of service and his New York fighting spirit that makes him such a tough runner...

Last year, she completed 19 5Ks and power walked a half marathon. She ran more races than just about everyone in the club! And in many of those races, her age grade score was above 80%! And, she won her age group in every single race she entered, as she did this morning at the Firecracker 5K.

When we started talking about this year's awards, I opened the membership spreadsheet and sorted it by join date – I was actually looking for the newer members for the newcomer of the year award and I decided to scroll down to the bottom – and there on the very last line or first I guess, was Jane Dods, with a join date of January 1, 1980. Now, some of you may not know who Jane is as she moved to Oregon quite some time ago, but she renews her membership to LA Frontrunners every year.

A few years ago, we gave Jane the Lifetime Achievement Award to honor her status as a Founding member and for her decades of service to the club and the sport of running. That award was richly deserved, and I remember being so moved by Jane's comments about overcoming the many obstacles that existed for female athletes in decades past.



But as Jane's results arrived in my in-box this year, I realized that Jane is still out there blazing trails, still out there obliterating obstacles, still out there setting an example, still out there kicking ass.

That makes me happy. That makes me want to be just like her when I grow up. And that makes me so proud to award the 2015 LA Frontrunners President's Award to Jane Dods.





Lifetime Achievement Award Jim Martinez presented by David Dassey

The Lifetime Achievement Award is given to a Frontrunner with at least a decade of membership, to honor their athleticism, volunteerism, and dedication to the club. This year's honoree, Jim Martinez, joined LAFR in 1999 and I think it's safe to say that every single member knows him and has enjoyed his many contributions to our club these past 16 years. Newcomer of the Year Erin Brinton

Our newcomer of the year came to us about halfway through last year. In the second half of 2015, she finished 1st in her age group at the Jet to Jetty 10K and Tiger Run 10K. On Thanksgiving, she finished 2nd in her age group at the Burbank Turkey Trot 5K. She ran her very first half marathon at the Revel Canyon Half Marathon, where she placed 2nd in her age group. She was also the 2nd overall female finisher in both the Jingle Bell 5K and the Reindeer Run 15K. She topped three of the four year-end lists of fastest LAFR women for 2015. If you go to the Tuesday night run, or Wednesday track at CalTech or either weekend run, you no doubt have already enjoyed her sweet nature and sly sense of humor. She has been an outstanding volunteer since joining Frontrunners, and is a new addition to the Board of Directors for 2016. The newcomer of the year is Erin Brinton.

Eric raced 7 times in 2015. His 2:44:02 at the Boston Marathon was the fastest marathon in the club last year and he had the fastest 5K and 10K as well. He was the overall winner in three races: the SRLA Friendship Run 18 Miler, the Long Beach Pride 5K and the Mt. Juliet Half Marathon. He was also 2nd overall in the LAFR Pride Run 10K and 3rd overall in the 5K, and 2nd overall in the ultra. He also had the highest year end score in the history of the Champions Race.

Mark trekked to the start line 7 times in 2015. In 5 of those races, he raced to first place in his age group and was the overall winner of both the SRLA Friendship Run 9 miler and the Shamrock 15K. Of the 9 years of the Champions race, this is his 6th time placing in the top 3 - and along with Carlos, who also has 6 appearances in the top 3 - Mark is one short of Richard Nelson's mens record of 7 years in the top 3. This runner is also on a 5 year consecutive streak in the top 3, just 2 short of Richard Nelson's 7 in a row.

Carlos had an outstanding year of racing highlighted by an exceptional marathon performance last year at LA, where he ran 2:46:59 and placed 3rd in his age group. He also ran a 1:17:44 half marathon that was the fastest in the club last year. He was 3rd overall in the Long Beach Pride 5K and 3rd overall in the Catalina Eco Marathon and placed in his age group in 4 other races, winning three. In addition to being the fastest half marathoner in the club last year, he had the 2nd fastest 5K and full marathon times.

<u>Sean</u> is a returning Trail Master champ who raced on the trails 5 times last year, one 50K, two 100Ks and two 50 milers – so, yes, if you're paying attention, the shortest race he did last year was 50K. He won the Old Goats 50K and placed in his age group at the Leona 50 Miler and the 100K of the trail race named for him.

<u>Danny</u> raced 8 trail races last year, including finishing his first Angeles Crest 100 Miler. He also was 3rd overall in the Deo 50K and placed in his age group in three other races.

<u>Deo</u> raced 10 trail races last year – 8 50Ks and 2 full marathons and he placed in his age group in 2 of those races.

Erin, the womens Champion is a new face to LAFR who raced 6 times last year. Of those 6 races, she was either 1st or 2nd in her age group in every race and was 2nd overall in two of them. She was the fastest female last year at 5K, 10K and half marathon and her half marathon time of 1:36:16 would be 7th on the mens top 10 list for the year.

Margie continues a streak that she and she alone owns in the history of the Champions Race. She is the only LAFR, male or female, to place in the top 3 in the Champions Race every year since we began the Champions Race 9 years ago. She raced 29 races last year. She placed in her age group in 21 of her races, winning in 14 of them.

Allyne only raced three times last year but produced excellent results each time she raced. She won her age group at both the Griffith Park Half Marathon and the LA River 5K and was the 2nd fastest female last year in the 5K, half and full marathons.





Most Improved Barry Hamaguchi

Barry Hamaguchi did what no other Frontrunner did in 2015 – he PR'd at all four standard distances. He set new PRs at 5K in 21:14, 10K in 46:25, half marathon in 1:38:14 and full marathon in 3:39:15.



Most Improved Honorable Mention Marcelino Goncalves & Mario Mota

<u>Marcelino</u> set new PRs at 5K, 10K and the full marathon last year, qualifying for the Boston Marathon for the first time.

<u>Mario</u> also set PRs in 3 of the 4 standard distances. He lowered his 10K PR to 46:45, his half marathon PR to 1:44:06 and his full marathon to 3:45:20.





2/7 Sean O'Brien Trail Races



How awesome to have a race named after you! That's the case for Sean O'Brien, a former president and board member at LAFR. But Sean was plagued for the first two races. During the inaugural race, an injury prevented him from running at all. In the second year, inclement weather (as in cold and wet) impaired his performance. Finally in the third year, the weather gods decided to make it unseasonably warm. While that sucks for most runners, it turned out well for Sean, who came in 7th overall in the 50 mile category.

Fellow LAFR Deo and former LAFR Mike Murphy also completed the 50K.

The race has distances of marathon, 50K, 50 mile, and 100K. The terrain was very rough, traversing back hills of Malibu, starting and ending in Malibu Creek State Park. The unseasonable heat also added to the pain.

While all this was happening, another group of LAFR was volunteering at the water station around mile 49. This was only for the 100K runners, so they did not see any of the LAFR folks. No matter, the volunteers were ready to assist all the runners anyway.

But it was a very long wait. The first runner was over an hour later than last year. Also the number of runners was rather low. It turned out that the heat was more brutal than felt by the volunteers, who were comfortably shaded by a few towering oak trees. Also not running helped. It turned out that quite a few runners dropped to a shorter distance or dropped out all together.

No matter. These volunteers still showered their enthusiasm and aid on the 100K runners. And just had more time to while the time away in a beautiful setting.




3/17 St Patrick's Day Potluck


